

Removing Pendimethalin Stains

The following are helpful hints on removing pendimethalin stains from different surfaces:

- The products suggested should be tried in the order listed. For example: use soap and water before bug and tar remover when there is staining on auto finishes
- **Always** test a small area of the surface before attempting the treatment on a large scale
- The longer the stain is allowed to set, the more difficult it will be to remove. Staining that appears on outside surfaces will fade with time due to light degrading the active ingredient
- An abrasive sponge or scouring pad may also help on hard surfaces

Surface	Suggested Cleaning Products
Auto finishes	Soap and water, aerosol brake cleaner, bug and tar remover, WD40®, auto polishing/rubbing compound
Carpets, fabrics	K-2R® spot remover, ammonia cleaner, Capture® carpet cleaner, acetone
Concrete, stucco, wood fences	Ammonia cleaner, aerosol brake cleaner, power washer
Golf shoes	Magic eraser®, aerosol brake cleaner, ammonia cleaner, WD40
Pets	GoJo® hand cleaner, Orange peels® wipes
Skin	Baby oil, Orange peels wipes, GoJo hand cleaner
Spray equipment, sinks	Magic eraser, aerosol brake cleaner, WD40
Tile, siding	Magic eraser, aerosol brake cleaner, ammonia cleaner, WD40, auto polishing/rubbing compound
Wood floors	Baby oil, WD40
